ROY ELLIS TO SPEAK ON NOVEMBER 14

Conducting the 1990 Census: An Overview

Roy Ellis, Assistant Manager of the United States Census Bureau's Chicago Region, will be the speaker at our November luncheon. In his talk, Mr. Ellis will give us a "walk-through" of the Bureau's plans for the 1990 Census. He will focus on the operational procedures, timetables, and quality control measures which the Bureau will employ to ensure that the data will be timely and accurate. He will also look at how the Bureau will be counting special populations within the Chicago region (such as the homeless, those living in public housing projects, and the Hispanic community). Information about the release of Census products will be given in this talk.

Our speaker has had a distinguished career in the Census Bureau. Prior to joining the Chicago office, Roy spent three years in Washington, D.C. as Assistant Branch Chief for Management and Planning. In that job, he helped to design the overall plan for the 1990 Census. He started his career in the Seattle Regional Office as a statistician and geographer. Roy has a Master's degree from the University of Vermont in Geography and Economics.
